Swimming

- Indoor swimming at the Cobourg family YMCA. (905) 372-0161.
- Hastings, west of the Bridge on both the north and south sides of the Trent-Severn Waterway.
- Cobourg Creek across from McDonald's has some neat wading areas.

- Little Lake Public Beach at the point where Trent Valley Rd turns into Lake Rd (south of Edville).
