WHAT'S UNIQUE: a historic lakeshore highway • breathtaking views
• Ontario's best-preserved main street • early churches & settlements

- 01 Wesleyville Village**
Wesleyville Rd., Port Hope
Start your adventure in Wesleyville Village with carefully preserved history (c. 1899) reflected in the one-room schoolhouse, church and cemetery.
- 02 Joseph Scriven Monument**
Memorial Park, Queen St., Port Hope
Take Lakeshore Rd. to historic Walton St. Turn right onto Queen St. to visit the Joseph Scriven Monument. Scriven (1819-1896) penned the hymn "What A Friend We Have In Jesus."
- 03 Founding of Port Hope Plaque** 
Memorial Park, Queen St., Port Hope
At the front of the Town Hall, learn about the Founding of Port Hope and its first area settler (Peter Smith in 1788).
- 04 Statue of Lt. Col. Arthur William**
Port Hope Town Hall, 56 Queen St., Port Hope
Near Port Hope's town hall (c. 1851), pose beside the Statue of Lt. Col. Arthur William, the hero of the Battle of Batoche.

- 05 St. Mark's Church**
51 King St., Port Hope
Immerse yourself in Port Hope's historic district, ending up at St. Mark's Church (c. 1822) one of Canada's earliest frame churches.
- 06 Farini Bridge & Gardens, plus Farley Mowat Monument** 
Walton & Mill Sts., Port Hope
Visit the monument to Canadian author Farley Mowat on the east side of the Ganaraska River. Nearby on Walton St., view where The Great Farini walked a tightrope over the river in 1859.
- 07 Ganaraska Millennium Conservation Area**
2216 County Rd. 28, Port Hope
Head north to the Ganaraska Millennium Conservation Area, located alongside the Ganaraska River.
- 08 Canton United Church**
4th Line, Port Hope
Step into 1811 by visiting the public cemetery near Canton United Church. (Church is exterior viewing only.)

- 09 St. Paul's Anglican Church**
6876 County Rd. 10, Perrytown
Follow County Rd. 10 north to St. Paul's Anglican Church (c. 1914) modelled after an English parish church.
- 10 Dorothy's House Museum***
3632 Ganaraska Rd., Garden Hill
Pass through Garden Hill to find Dorothy's House Museum. This 1800s frame cottage was restored to resemble a working man's cottage of that period.
- 11 Richardson's Lookout Conservation Area**
County Rd. 9, Campbellcroft
Visit Richardson's Lookout Conservation Area to take in elevated views or have a relaxed picnic.
- 12 Haute Goat**
1166 5th Line, Port Hope
Follow County Rd. 65 to the 5th Line where, at Haute Goat, you can "shmurgle" (hug) farm animals and purchase handmade goat milk confections, soaps and lotions.
